- 1. What specific responsibilities and instructions did God give to Adam before He created Eve (Genesis 2:15-18)?
- 2. Why do you think God asked Adam to work and keep a garden that was already "pleasant to the sight and good for food" (Genesis 2:9,15)?
- 3. What was the one direct prohibition that God gave to Adam in the garden (Genesis 2:17)?
- 4. What words are given in God's prohibition that leads us to believe God was protecting something precious more than withholding something pleasant (Genesis 2:16-17)?
- 5. Why do you think the words, "It is not good that the man should be alone," came out of God's voice before the words came out of Adam (Genesis 2:18)?

APPLYING GOD'S WORD

- 1. What in God's creation (relationships, jobs, resources, etc.) has He entrusted you to work and cultivate? How are you using your gifts to beautify what He has entrusted?
- 2. What instructions has God given you that you routinely question are in your best interest? What would it take for you to trust God in these areas?
- 3. Why do you believe it is not in our best interest to live this life alone? How are you cultivating your friendships?
- 4. What characteristics should a person cultivate to prepare them for healthy relationships that glorify the Lord?
