Reading God's Word

Matthew 6:19-24; 2 Corinthians 8:1-5; 9:6-8

Discussing God's Word

- 1. What phrase is repeated in verses 19-20? What does Jesus instruct those listening not to do? By contrast, what does He tell them to do instead?
- 2. We have discussed verse 21 in previous weeks. Where are our hearts, according to Jesus? What analogy does He give in verses 22-23?
- 3. Who does Jesus list that we cannot serve in verse 24?
- 4. In 2 Corinthians 8, who does Paul share about? What does he describe them doing? To whom did these people first give themselves?
- 5. Similar to Jesus, Paul gives two contrasts in 2 Corinthians 9:6 what are they? How should one give?

Applying God's Word

- 1. What things come to mind that you have really enjoyed but moth and rust have now destroyed or someone stole?
- 2. Scripture tells us that we cannot serve both God and money, but how do we try to serve both?
- 3. How do we know that this passage isn't teaching that Christians cannot be wealthy?
- 4. Paul makes it clear that God loves a cheerful giver (2 Cor. 9:7). What is cheerful about giving? If we don't have joy in our hearts to give how can we create that joy?
- 5. What is the reasoning for God's sufficiency (look at the end verse 8)? How does knowing the character of our God encourage your heart toward generous living?
